Canadian Belle wins NHRA Summit Racing Series Super Pro National Championship



North Central Division's Les Belle, of Springfield, Ont., scored the biggest win of his racing career when he captured the NHRA Summit Racing Series Super Pro National Championship at the 38th annual Automobile Club of Southern California NHRA Finals in Pomona, Calif.

Belle, runner-up to Bob Biser, of Columbus, Ohio, at the NHRA Summit Racing Series North Central Division Finals in September was called upon to make the trip west when Biser was unable to go. Belle received \$5,000 for the National Championship win from Summit in addition to his \$3,500 qualifier money.

Burt Exman, the Division 3 Super Pro Motorcycle representative, made it to the semifinal round before bowing out to eventual winner Richard Pedraza from Division 6. Jack Spivey in Pro and Terry McGee in Sportsman both went out in double-breakout first-round losses. Each of the 28 National Championship participants collected \$3,500 as part of the overall \$118,000 National Championship cash purse.

Bo Boles claims second Jeg's Super Quick title

Bo Boles had one of those racing seasons of which a racer dreams. He scored four event victories on his way to collecting his second NHRA Jeg's Super Quick Series division championship title. The Slaughters, Ky., racer last won the championship in 1998 and joins Randy Estridge ('89 and '90), Tim Branon ('94 and '01), and Tommy Radloff ('96 and '97) as two-time series champions. Boles' 150-point victory margin was the largest in the 14-year history of the series.

Boles and the other top 10 drivers in the year-end points standings will be honored at the annual North Central Division Awards Banquet, Jan. 11 in Indianapolis. Each of the top 10 will receive special Jeg's Super Quick Series jackets, and the top three finishers will share \$3,500 in bonus cash from Jeg's.

NHRA NATIONAL EVENT ENTRY GRADING INFORMATION

Due to the growing numbers of contestants, constraints on pit space, and scheduling time, a certain criteria must be met before a contestant may enter an NHRA National Event. The NHRA grading system determines who gains entry to the National Events and subsequently, rewards National Event aspirants who support Divisional activity.

A driver receives one (1) grading point for attending a Divisional NHRA Lucas Oil Drag Racing Series event or National Open event. The grading points earned in either the previous year or the current year (whichever is greater) stand as the driver's "grade".

NOTE: Meeting these requirements does not guarantee event entry acceptance.

Provisional entries: 1) A contestant with a valid NHRA Gold, Silver, or Bronze card will be guaranteed entry to any National Event. 2) The defending event champion will be guaranteed entry to the event he/she won. For example, last years Super Gas winner at the Finals would be guaranteed entry into this years Finals (entry would not be guaranteed to any other event however). 3) A former national champion (Pro or Sportsman) will be guaranteed entry to any National Event. 4) A Professional driver earning Top 20 status in the current or previous season will be guaranteed a Sportsman entry to any National Event. 5) Owner credits may be awarded in cases involving a driver change from one season to the next (contestant must receive approval from their Division Director). 6) A contestant within the top 20, and still in contention for a possible Top 10 year-end position, will be guaranteed entry to any of the final four National Events of the racing season (Chicago 2, Dallas, Las Vegas 2, and Pomona 2). These policies do not excuse the contestant from any late fees, gate entry fees, or insurance surcharges. For example, if a Gold card holder shows up at the gate for an event, the \$75 late fee, plus the \$75 gate fee, plus the \$40 insurance fee will still be applicable.

To accommodate certain hardship cases or a past racers return to active competition, an averaging system has been developed. The average grade is calculated as follows: the racer's 3 previous years grading points are added together and divided by 3. For example, in 2002 a racer ran 1 division event, in '01 - 0 events, and in '00 - 5 division events equaling 1 + 0 + 5 = 6, divided by 3, equals a grade of 2A (the "A" indicating the averaging calculation).

To accommodate foreign contestants, grading points will be issued for participation in selected foreign events. Those events are the FIA European Championship, Australian Drag Racing Championship, Nordic Super Cup Championships, and Japan Drag Racing Association Championship. Each entry application must include written confirmation from the host country sanctioning organization verifying participation in their series.

A contestant competing in one category at some events and another category at others should notify the Division Director of the situation so that all grading points will be awarded to the driver. Similarly, if a contestant competes at an NHRA Lucas Oil Drag Racing Series event outside his/her Division, it is that contestant's responsibility to make sure that grading points for all events attended are awarded.

NHRA Division Directors handle the administration of the grading system. Contestants make their request for National Event entry forms for the year by filling out the National Event Request Form (NERF) and returning it to their Division Director. The Division Director "grades" the contestant based on the criteria outlined above.
